CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSISSIPPI BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 15, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Jake Files of Clinton High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade Mississippi Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Files is the second Gatorade Mississippi Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Clinton High School.

The 6-foot-3, 180-pound senior goalkeeper led the Arrows to a 23-2-2 record and the Class 6A state championship this past season. Files allowed 12 goals and recorded 15 shutouts, including back-to-back whitewashes in the state final four. The 2012 Clarion Ledger Player of the Year, he concluded his prep soccer career with 20 shutouts.

Files has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom and scored a perfect 36 on his ACT. An Eagle Scout with the Boy Scouts of America, he has volunteered locally at the Blair E. Batson Children's Hospital and as a researcher in the University of Mississippi Medical Center's biochemistry department.

"Jake Files is a tremendous keeper," said Jesse Lang, head coach of rival Oak Grove High. "When Clinton had no offense, he kept them in the game."

Files has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Spring Hill College in Alabama this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
