UNION HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9 senior forward scored 22 goals and passed for eight assists this past season, leading the Redskins (13-2-1) to the Class 6A state championship game and a No. 11 national ranking in the ESPNHS Fab 50. Mata is a three-time All-District selection and a two-time member of the Tulsa All-Metro Team.

Mata has maintained a 3.10 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs and camps.

"Mata is phenomenal," said Craig Liddell, head coach at Enid High. "He's so clever with the ball, and he's a great finisher. He's a real difference-maker."

Mata has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Tulsa University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
