## OAK MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALABAMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Harnett scored 29 goals and passed for 33 assists, including three goals and four assists in Oak Mountain's five-game run in the state tournament. A 2011 Birmingham News All-Metro selection, Harnett made the All-Tournament Team at the 2012 Southern Shootout and Lakeshore Shootout. She concluded her prep soccer career with 39 goals and 46 assists.

Harnett has maintained a 3.88 GPA in the classroom. A member of the Mu Alpha Theta mathematics honor society, she has volunteered locally with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Birmingham and at The Regions Tradition golf tournament to support Children's of Alabama hospital.

"Bailee Harnett has grown to become one of the best players in the state of Alabama and has had success at every level," said Jason Lockhart, Harnett's former club coach with Birmingham United. "She is a major player for every team she plays for."

Harnett will attend the Air Force Academy this fall, where she will play soccer.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
