DIMOND HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALASKA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-4 junior forward led the Lynx to a 16-1-1 record entering the state tournament, scheduled for May 24. Lewis scored 22 goals and passed for three assists through 18 games. A two-year team captain, she was a First Team All-Cook Inlet Conference selection.

Lewis has maintained a 3.43 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, the Salvation Army and youth soccer programs.

"She has tremendous athletic ability and good skills," said Mark Cascolan, head coach at rival Service High. "She's a game-changer, just a dangerous, dangerous player."

Lewis will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
