Horney has maintained a 3.49 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Blue-Gold Club, which raises funds and organizes activities for special needs students.

"Casey Horney is the complete package," said Eddie Gibbons, head coach at St. Elizabeth High. "She has great technique on the ball, with explosive speed to get behind defenders, and she consistently makes good decisions."

Horney has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Delaware this fall.
