KAMEHAMEHA SCHOOLS-KAPALAMA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE HAWAII GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 senior forward and midfielder led the Warriors to a 13-1-1 record and the Division I state title this past season. Neal scored 13 goals and passed for 12 assists. The Honolulu Star-Advertiser Player of the Year, she is a two-time Interscholastic League of Hawaii All-Star and a member of the 2012 Division I All-Tournament Team.

Neal has maintained a 3.67 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally with the Special Olympics and on behalf of multiple area road races.

"Carly Neal is an all-around player," said Cesar Robledo, head coach of rival Kamehameha School-Maui. "Top to bottom, she really tore us apart. She would play defense, she would play forward, and she was an attacking midfielder. She is solid."

Neal has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Texas at San Antonio this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
