## LADYWOOD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MICHIGAN SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 6, 2012) — In its 27<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Briana Combs of Ladywood High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade Michigan Softball Player of the Year. The 5-foot-8 senior pitcher led the Blazers (33-3) entering Division 2, Region 15 tournament semifinals, scheduled for June 9. Combs owned a 33-1 record with a 0.09 ERA and 364 strikeouts in 225 innings-pitched through 36 games. She recorded eight no-hitters, including three perfect games, and held opponents to a .046 batting average. At the plate, Combs batted .536 with 17 doubles, 43 runs scored, 35 RBI and a .818 slugging percentage entering the regional final four.

Combs has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally at a homeless shelter and food bank. She has also donated her time fundraising to benefit the American Cancer Society.

"Briana Combs is a fierce competitor," said Newton Barefoot, president emeritus of the Compuware ASA team. "She has taken the game to the next level on so many occasions with her mental toughness. She has the ability to spot the ball over the desired portion of the plate like no other pitcher I've known."

Combs has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Cleveland State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Combs joins recent Gatorade Michigan Softball Players of the Year Sara Driesenga (2008-09, 2009-10 & 2010-11, Hudsonville High School), and Jenna Ignowski (2007-08, Niles) among the state's list of former award winners.
