MACARTHUR HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW YORK SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 6, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Kristen Brown of MacArthur High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade New York Softball Player of the Year. Brown is the first Gatorade Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from MacArthur High School.

The 5-foot-9 senior shortstop/right-handed pitcher led the Generals to a 20-4 record entering the Class AA Long Island Championship Game against East Islip, scheduled for June 5. Brown owned a .564 batting average with 14 home runs and 42 RBI at the plate, and an 8-3 record with a 2.27 ERA in the circle through 24 games. She's a two-time First Team All-Long Island selection and was a Second Team All-State honoree as a junior.

Brown has maintained an A-minus average in the classroom. Also a volleyball standout, she has raised funds for breast cancer research and volunteered locally collecting Christmas gifts for needy children.

"Brown is the kind of kid you don't worry about getting a hit every time, you worry about her getting a home run every time," said Mike Muscara, head coach at rival Mepham High. "She's very good as a pitcher and she's a tremendous shortstop. I've been coaching 30 years and she's one of the top five players I've ever seen."

Brown has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at the University of North Carolina this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Brown joins recent Gatorade New York Softball Players of the Year Marissa Diescher (2010-11, Livingston Manor High School), Tammy Wray (2009-10, Somers), Olivia Galati (2008-09, St. John the Baptist) and Cassie Reilly-Boccia (2007-08, Yorktown) among the state's list of former award winners.
