ELDORADO HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEVADA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 22, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Ruben Duran of Eldorado High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade Nevada Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Duran is the first Gatorade Nevada Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Eldorado High School.

The 5-foot-10 senior midfielder scored 30 goals and passed for 23 assists this past season, leading the Sun Devils (17-1-1) to the Class 4A state semifinals. The 2011 Las Vegas Review Journal Boys Soccer Player of the Year, Duran was also the 2011 Northeast League MVP. He spent his junior year with the U.S. Soccer Under-17 Men's National Team Residency Program in Bradenton, Fla., and concluded his prep soccer career with 42 goals and 31 assists.

Duran has maintained a weighted 4.25 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and on behalf of his church in addition to serving as a charitable fundraiser to help send fellow soccer players to camps and clinics.

"Ruben Duran's work ethic is unbelievable," said Jason DiOrio, Duran's club coach with Las Vegas Premier. "Not only is he the hardest worker, but he's probably the biggest student of the game. He is always striving to get better. He's not only a threat attacking, but he is a defensive force as well."

Duran has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
