WESTVIEW HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OREGON BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 22, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Jaime Velasco of Westview High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade Oregon Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 6-foot, 165-pound senior forward led the Wildcats to an 18-2-2 record and the Class 6A state championship this past season. Velasco scored 30 goals and passed for 18 assists, including the only goal in both the state semifinals and the state final. The Oregonian's Class 6A Player of the Year and the Metro League Player of the Year, Velasco transferred to Westview from Anchorage, Alaska, before his junior year. He recorded 44 goals and 28 assists in two seasons with the Wildcats.

Velasco has maintained a 3.17 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as an elementary school aide and as a youth soccer coach.

"Jaime Velasco is a go-to player with great ball skills and he's so fast," said Jason Goodrich, head coach of Southridge High. "What sets him apart from other players are his play-making abilities and that he can finish on goal with multiple players on him. He can carry the team when needed with his talent and determination."

Velasco has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Portland this
