ST. HENRY DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE KENTUCKY GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 junior midfielder and forward scored 23 goals and passed for 13 assists this past season, leading the Crusaders (18-4) to the 9th Region championship game. The Kentucky Enquirer Player of the Year, Leedom is a two-time First Team All-State selection and was named 2010 State Tournament MVP when she led St. Henry to the state title. She has 86 goals and 33 assists through three varsity seasons.

Leedom has maintained a 4.28 weighted GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of a fundraising campaign to benefit breast cancer research and as a youth soccer coach.

"Libby Leedom played multiple positions and her greatest quality is her ability to play great soccer while making her teammates better," said Edmundo Echeverria, Ryle High head coach. "She makes her team better and elevates the level of play of those players around her."

Leedom has verbally committed to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Dayton beginning in the fall of 2013.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
