RAMAPO HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW IERSEY GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 9, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Caroline Chagares of Ramapo High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade New Jersey Girls Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-8 sophomore midfielder scored 27 goals and passed for eight assists this past season, leading the Green Raiders (19-4) to the North 1, Group 3 Region championship game. A member of the U.S. Soccer Under-17 Women's National Team and an All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Chagares is a two-time First Team All-State honoree. She has 48 goals and 20 assists through two varsity campaigns.

Chagares has maintained a 3.18 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a peer tutor, as a youth camp counselor and as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with her church youth group.

"There really are not enough words to describe a player like Caroline Chagares," said Tara Madigan, Northern Highlands High head coach. "It blows my mind how young she is, but her technical and tactical abilities are incredible. I would certainly consider Caroline one of the best players I have ever seen."

Chagares will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
