EAST ISLIP HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW YORK GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 senior midfielder/defender scored 11 goals and passed for four assists this past season, leading the Redmen to an 11-3-1 record. A First Team ESPNHS All-American, Roccaro is also a two-time All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and was named the Long Island Player of the Year. She is a member of the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-20 Women's National Team, which is currently competing at the Four Nations Tournament in La Manga, Spain.

Roccaro has maintained an A average in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a soccer program for children diagnosed with autism.

"Cari Roccaro is a great athlete and a total team player," said Jack Bayer, head coach of Newfield High. "She has great ability and vision and can go almost anywhere on the field."

Roccaro has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Notre Dame this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
