MCDONOGH 35 COLLEGE PREPARATORY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE LOUISIANA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9 sophomore won three individual Class 4A state titles this spring and led the Roneagles to the state championship as a team. Stalbert won the 100-meter dash with a time of 11.67 seconds, captured the 200-meter dash in 23.96 and won the 400-meter run in 53.73. She also ran the opening leg on the 4x200-meter relay quartet, which broke the tape in 1:38.89.

Stalbert has maintained a 3.07 GPA in the classroom. A peer tutor in her school, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a program that provides food and toys for underprivileged families during the holidays.

"Marcquita is a very focused and dedicated runner," said McDonogh #35 coach Frank Daggs. "Every time she takes the track, the sky is the limit. With her great work ethic, I can see her achieving whatever she wants in the future."

Stalbert will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
