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BREAUX BRIDGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE LOUISIANA BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 21, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Kavahra Holmes of Breaux Bridge High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade Louisiana Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Holmes is the first Gatorade Louisiana Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Breaux Bridge High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Holmes as Louisiana's best high school boys track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Holmes joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Meb Keflezighi (1993-94, San Diego HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.) and Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.).

The 6-foot-2 senior won the Class 4A state championship in the 400-meter run this spring with a time of 46.18 seconds, which ranked as the nation's No. 3 performance among prep competitors in 2012 at the time of his selection. The state's returning Gatorade Boys Track and Field Athlete of the Year, Holmes also anchored the 4x200-meter relay quartet to victory in 1:26.76, and the 4x400 meter relay squad to first place in 3:21.06, leading the Tigers to the state championship as a team.

Holmes has maintained a 3.09 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of multiple community service initiatives with the Beta Club and the Boy Scouts of America.

"What Kavahra has done for our school is bring track back to life," said Breaux Bridge High coach Brent Angelle. "He's changed the entire environment here; kids are coming out of the woodwork to run track now. He's been so much fun to watch as a coach. I may never see another kid run a 46-second 400."

Holmes has signed a National Letter of Intent to compete in track and field on scholarship at Louisiana State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Holmes joins recent Gatorade Louisiana Boys Track & Field Athletes of the Year Andreas Duplantis (2009-10, Lafayette), Richard Sheldon (2008-09, Episcopal), and Barrett Nugent (2007-08, North Vermillion) among the state's list of former award winners.
