## BAYSIDE ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALABAMA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Pittman collected 16 kills, five blocks, four digs and three service aces in a Class 3A state title sweep of Cottage Hill Christian Academy, capturing tournament Co-Most Valuable Player honors in the process.

Also a basketball standout, Pittman has maintained a weighted 4.06 weighted GPA in the classroom and serves in her school's student government. Also a prominent member of her school's Key Club International and National Honor Society chapters, she has volunteered on behalf of Distinguished Young Women, the Capstone Leadership Academy, the Alabama Girls State civics-awareness program and her church's youth group.

"Virginia Pittman is certainly an outstanding player," said Jennifer Newton, head coach of rival Cottage Hill Christian Academy. "We played against Bayside six times this past year alone, and in every match she was a dominant player. She is an obvious leader on their team. Also, she has always displayed exemplary sportsmanship. She is very outgoing and friendly to my players and other coaches.

Pittman remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
