A two-time First Team All-Conference selection, Bateman became her school's career assists leader with 1,819 entering her senior campaign.

Bateman has maintained a 3.53 GPA in the classroom. An active member of her church community, she has served as president of her school's chapter of Students Against Destructive Decisions.

"Becca Bateman is both a strong leader and the clear leader on a relatively young St. John's squad," said Dave Geiser, head coach at the Academy of the Holy Cross. "She was certainly the core of their offense and their best server. She is a very positive person who exhibits great sportsmanship to all players, coaches and referees."

Bateman will begin her senior year of high school next fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
