GARDNER-EDGERTON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® KANSAS VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Wait has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A member of her school's student council, she has volunteered locally as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with the National Honor Society and as a youth volleyball coach.

"Cassie Wait is a fantastic player and a great kid as well," said Dave Johnson, head coach at Blue Valley High. "She is a terrific front row and back row presence and she is the reason her high school team was so successful."

Wait has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Kansas beginning in the fall of 2013.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <u>USA TODAY High School Sports</u>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
