SPANISH SPRINGS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEVADA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Anderson has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. Also a talented musician, she has volunteered locally as a mentor for middle school students.

"She makes great decisions, she's a team leader and she does a great job of setting the ball," said Jason Sterrett, head coach at Bishop Manogue High. "She can do just about everything on a volleyball court."

Anderson has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Nevada beginning in the fall of 2013.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Anderson joins recent Gatorade Nevada Volleyball Players of the Year Makenna Lommori (2011-12 & 2010-11, Yerington High School), Siga Appelgate (2009-10, Green Valley) and Hayley Spelman (2008-09 & 2007-08, Green Valley) among the state's list of former award winners.
