## FARGO NORTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NORTH DAKOTA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Larson has maintained a 3.63 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a volleyball camp counselor, on behalf of the Salvation Army and as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with her church youth group.

"Kira Larson is most definitely one of the best players we have seen in our state in recent years," said Jessica Nichols, head coach at Bismarck High. "Her offense is her strong point. She is very tall and jumps extremely well and can get around almost any block."

Larson has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Nebraska beginning in the fall of 2013.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
