## COPPELL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® TEXAS VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A 2012-13 Under Armour First Team All-American, Ogbogu was named Class 4A-5A Player of the Year by the Texas Girls Coaches Association and is a member of the LoneStarVolleyball.com All-Texas First Team.

Ogbogu has maintained a B average in the classroom. An active member of her church youth group and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Coppell Community Gardens and the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

"She's a very talented player," said Tricia Roos, head coach at Ryan High. "She jumps high, makes smart decisions on the front row and blocks extremely well. It's very hard to get around her block."

Ogbogu has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Texas beginning in the fall of 2013.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
