## LONE PEAK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® UTAH VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A 2012-13 Under Armour First Team All-American, Willey was named Class 5A MVP by the Salt Lake Tribune and also helped the 2012 U.S. Women's Junior National Team win a bronze medal at the 2012 NORCECA Women's Junior (U-20) Continental Championship in Managua, Nicaragua.

Willey has maintained a 3.98 GPA in the classroom. A peer tutor in her school, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a homeless shelter, the Special Olympics and the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

"She's just a fantastic player," said Scott Keister, head coach at Riverton High. "She has the ability to see the court in the air, which makes her difficult to stop. She has tremendous vision and she's a great leader for that team."

Willey has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at Arizona State University beginning in the fall of 2013. She will graduate early to begin attending classes on the Tempe campus during the upcoming spring semester.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
