## KODIAK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALASKA BOYS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 sophomore raced to the Class 4A individual state championship this past season with a time of 16:11, leading the Bears to third place as a team. Thomet also won the Region 3 Championship meet, the Skyview Invitational, the Palmer Invitational and the Bartlett Invitational.

Thomet has maintained a 3.75 GPA in the classroom. Also a hockey standout and an accomplished pianist, Thomet has served on his school's student council.

"Levi is ambitious, and a very hard worker," said Kodiak head coach Marcus Dunbar. "He is a tough competitor who welcomes good competition and is always looking to improve."

Thomet will begin his junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
