## KENAI CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALASKA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 10, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Allie Ostrander of Kenai Central High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade Alaska Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Ostrander is the first Gatorade Alaska Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Kenai Central High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Ostrander as Alaska's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Ostrander joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot sophomore raced to the Class 4A individual state championship this past season with a time of 18:46. The state's returning Gatorade Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year, Ostrander also won the Skyview Invitational, the Bartlett Invitational, the Palmer Invitational and the Region III championship.

Ostrander has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church youth group, she has volunteered on behalf of a local food bank and youth soccer programs.

"She's clearly been in a class of her own," said Marcus Dunbar, head coach at Kodiak High. "She's a special runner. I think she's someone who could make a mark at the national level."

Ostrander will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <u>USA TODAY High School Sports</u>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Ostrander joins Gatorade Alaska Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Jenette Northey (2010-11, Service High School), Kailey Wilson (2009-10, Kenny Lake School), and Leah Francis (2008-09 & 2007-08, Juneau-Douglas) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
