GEORGETOWN VISITATION PREPARATORY SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-4 sophomore raced to first place at the Independent School League Championships this past season with a time of 18:51, leading the Cubs to second place as a team. Kaplan also finished second at the Glory Days Invitational, fourth at the William & Mary Invitational, fifth at the Maymont Invitational and eighth at the Octoberfest Invitational.

Kaplan has maintained a 4.19 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered on behalf of a local assisted living facility.

"She ran outdoor track last year and you could tell she was an extremely gifted runner," said Georgetown Visitation head coach Kevin Hughes. "It took some time for her to understand that cross country was a little different than track, but eventually she got it. She's an extremely hard worker who pushes herself to the limits to succeed. She has a very bright future."

Kaplan will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
