## ST. MARYS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE WEST VIRGINIA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 10, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Maggie Drazba of St. Marys High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade West Virginia Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Drazba is the first Gatorade West Virginia Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from St. Marys High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Drazba as West Virginia's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Drazba joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot-1 senior raced to her third Class AA-A individual state championship in four years this past season with a time of 17:17.89. The returning Gatorade West Virginia Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year, Drazba earned third place at the Foot Locker South Regional championships, crossing the line in 17:10 to qualify for the national Foot Locker Cross Country Championships. There, she finished 22nd in the country with a time of 18:06.

Drazba has maintained a 4.05 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community and the treasurer of her school's student body, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Boys and Girls Club of America and the National Honor Society.

"Maggie Drazba is amazing, on and off the trail," said Melissa Kaiser, head coach at Philip Barbour High. "I have had the privilege to watch her become the runner that she is over the last three years. She trains endlessly and continues to amaze spectators with her performances."

Drazba has verbally committed to an athletic scholarship at the University of West Virginia beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Drazba joins Gatorade West Virginia Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Sarah McCauley (2010-11, Philip Barbour High School), Alex Dent (2009-10, Hurricane), and Letitia Propst (2008-09 & 2007-08, Elkins), as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
