## ST. IGNATIUS COLLEGE PREP. STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ILLINOIS BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 19, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Brandon Medina of St. Ignatius College Prep. as its 2012-13 Gatorade Illinois Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-7, 130-pound senior midfielder scored 11 goals and passed for 17 assists this past season, leading the Wolfpack (20-4-1) to the regional semifinal in the Class 3A Hinsdale Central Sectional Tournament. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Medina participated in the High School Soccer All-American Game in Birmingham, Ala., in December. He concluded his prep soccer career with 37 goals and 41 assists.

Medina has maintained a weighted 3.94 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as an elementary school tutor and youth soccer coach.

"Brandon Medina is technically amazing," said Robert Watson, head coach of Fenwick High. "He has very good foot skill, awareness and technical ability. He is dangerous and a threat to score from anywhere. He is the field general for Ignatius and literally makes them tick."

Medina has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Northwestern University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
