TRINITY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE KENTUCKY BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 19, 2013) — In its 28th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Chris Hubbard of Trinity High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade Kentucky Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Hubbard is the fifth Gatorade Kentucky Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Trinity High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Hubbard as Kentucky's best high school boys soccer player. The 6-foot-4, 200-pound senior goalkeeper recorded 16 shutouts and allowed eight goals this past season, leading the Shamrocks (20-2-1) to the 7th Region Tournament final. A First Team All-State selection by the Kentucky High School Soccer Coaches Association, Hubbard participated in the High School Soccer All-American Game in Birmingham, Ala., in December. He concluded his prep soccer career with 50 shutouts.

Hubbard has maintained a 3.86 GPA in the classroom. The senior class president at Trinity, he has volunteered locally as a peer tutor and as a school ambassador. He has also donated his time as part of a fundraising campaign to benefit African clean water initiatives.

"Trinity was solid this year, but Hubbard was the clear star and was crucial to their success," said Brad Davies, head coach of Louisville Collegiate School. "Take Chris off of Trinity, and I think they would have been impacted significantly."

Hubbard has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Notre Dame this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
