BEDFORD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW HAMPSHIRE BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 19, 2013) — In its 28th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Erik Martel of Bedford High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade New Hampshire Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-9, 156-pound senior forward scored 17 goals and passed for 11 assists this past season, leading the Bulldogs to the Division 1 state semifinals. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Martel was also a three-time First Team All-State honoree and the Union Leader Player of the Year.

Martel has maintained a 3.55 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs.

"Physically, Martel is a tremendous competitor," said Jeff Colbert, head coach at Londonderry High. "He's technically sound, great speed, good strength on the ball. He's just an excellent player who is difficult to match up against."

Martel has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of New Hampshire.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
