## BRENTWOOD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW YORK BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 19, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Jeff Medina of Brentwood High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade New York Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Medina is the second Gatorade New York Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Brentwood High School.

The 6-foot-2, 165-pound senior defender led the Indians (22-1) to the Class AA state final this past season. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Medina sparked a defense that allowed just eight goals and notched 18 shutouts. He is a two-time All-State honoree and was also chosen as the Long Island Player of the Year.

Medina has maintained a B-plus average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of hurricane relief efforts and youth soccer programs.

"Medina has all the good things you'd want in a player," said Matt Stallone, head coach at Sachem East High. "He's a physical presence in the back and he has a great ability to read the game."

Medina has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Stony Brook University.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
