## CARDINAL GIBBONS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NORTH CAROLINA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 19, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Ade Taiwo of Cardinal Gibbons High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade North Carolina Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 6-foot-1, 180-pound junior forward scored 12 goals and passed for 11 assists this past season, leading the Crusaders (18-5-3) to the Class 3A state semifinals. The 2012 North Carolina Soccer Coaches Association State Player of the Year, Taiwo was an All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and the Raleigh News & Observer All-Metro Player of the Year. He concluded his junior year with 47 goals and 25 assists in his prep soccer career.

Taiwo has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and referee.

"Ade is a great player that can play multiple positions and take over a game," said Travis Seese, head coach of Athens Drive High. "He is bigger and faster than most everyone on the field and he has the skills to go along with his athletic ability."

Taiwo has verbally committed to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at N.C. State University beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
