HURRICANE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE WEST VIRGINIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 19, 2013) — In its 28th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Felipe Thompson of Hurricane High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade West Virginia Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Thompson is the first Gatorade West Virginia Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Hurricane High School.

The 6-foot-1, 170 pound senior forward scored 49 goals and passed for 12 assists this past season, leading the Redskins (23-0-1) to the Class AAA state title. Thompson was the West Virginia High School Soccer Coaches Association Class AAA Player of the Year and was named captain of the Class AAA All-State team by the West Virginia Sports Writers Association.

Thompson has maintained a B-plus average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a nursing home and has also donated his time at youth soccer clinics.

"Thompson really had an impact on West Virginia high school soccer," said Dan Fosselman, head coach at Parkersburg High. "We don't get many players of his skill and tactical awareness. He was something very special."

Thompson remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
