A First Team All-Region selection, she was the leading scorer in the state final for the third straight year and is rated as the No. 13 recruit in the Class of 2014 by Blue Star Basketball.

Ekmark has maintained a 4.32 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has participated in literacy-outreach initiatives and volunteered locally feeding the homeless.

"Ekmark is a fantastic basketball player," said Lisa Contreras, head coach at Westview High. "She does a great job of reading the defense and coming off picks, and she's an outstanding shooter."

Ekmark will begin her senior year of high school this fall.
