## LINCOLN SOUTHEAST HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEBRASKA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 14, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Jessica Shepard of Lincoln Southeast High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade Nebraska Girls Basketball Player of the Year. The 6-foot-3 sophomore wing led the Knights to a 24-3 record and the Class A state championship this past season. A returning First Team Super-State selection as named by The Lincoln Journal Star, Shepard averaged 24.6 points, 11.1 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 2.0 blocks and 1.8 steals per game. She amassed 26 points, 19 rebounds, five blocks, four assists and a steal in a 65-57, title-clinching victory against Bellevue West. Her 81 points in three state tournament games set a Class A record.

Shepard has maintained a 3.84 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of her church, People's City Mission, the Center for People in Need and Matt Talbot Kitchen and Outreach.

"Jess is far and away the best player in this year's field," said Jon Perone, head coach of rival Benson High. "Her versatility to handle the ball, come out and play on the perimeter, and score in the post is unique. Her size and ability cause matchup problems everywhere. Most importantly, Shepard sees the game and feels the game so well, her basketball IQ is second to none and that is why she is such a dominant player."

Shepard will begin her junior year of high school this fall and has verbally committed to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Nebraska in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
