She is a First Team All-Metro selection and a member of the Vermont Basketball Coaches Association Dream Dozen.

Kinneston has maintained a 3.90 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, youth sports camps and a literacy-outreach program.

"She is the most complete player we have in the state," said Glenn Johnson, head coach at Bellows Free Academy-St.

Albans. "She plays the game the right way and she can take a game over on the defensive end and the offensive end."

Kinneston will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
