SERVICE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-3, 187-pound senior guard has led the Cougars to a 27-2 record and a berth in the Class 4A state quarterfinals against Dimond, scheduled for March 21. Klie is averaging 19.2 points, 10.1 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.9 steals per game entering the state playoffs. A First Team All-State selection, he was named to the All-State Tournament Team each of the last two seasons.

Klie has maintained a 4.22 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered as an elementary school teacher's aide and as a math and physics tutor in his school.

"He's very skilled and unselfish," said Ryan Engebretsen, head coach at Wasilla High. "He's explosive offensively, but he's willing to sacrifice his stats and do the nitty gritty stuff that his team needs."

Klie remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
