HALL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ARKANSAS BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-9, 220-pound senior forward led the Warriors to a 26-5 record and the Class 6A state championship this past season. Portis averaged 20.4 points, 10.3 rebounds, 3.8 blocks and 2.1 assists per game. A four-time state champion, he was selected to play in the Jordan Brand Classic and the McDonald's All-American games and is rated the nation's No. 13 recruit in the Class of 2013 by ESPN.

Portis has maintained a 3.29 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs.

"Portis has the total package," said Eric Burnett, head coach at Northside High. "He runs, jumps, shoots the three, posts up. You can't double team him because he's so smart and he's such a good passer."

Portis has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Arkansas this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
