## NORTH POINT HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MARYLAND BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-1, 180-pound senior point guard averaged 16.6 points, 6.1 assists, 4.7 rebounds and 3.9 steals this past season, leading the Eagles (24-3) to the Class 4A semifinals. A two-time Southern Maryland Athletic Conference MVP, Wright concluded his high school career with 1,084 points, 560 assists, 325 rebounds and 290 steals as a four-year varsity player.

Wright has maintained a 3.08 GPA in the classroom. A devoted parishioner in his church community, he has volunteered locally as a youth basketball camp counselor.

"Marquis Wright is a very cerebral point guard who has all the tools to lead a college team," said Dale Lamberth, head coach at Thomas Stone High. "Having competed against his team over the past four years, I have seen tremendous growth in his leadership and skills on the court."

Wright has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on an athletic scholarship at Loyola University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
