CHANDLER PARK ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MICHIGAN BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 21, 2013) — In its 28th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Derrick Walton Jr. of Chandler Park Academy as its 2012-13 Gatorade Michigan Boys Basketball Player of the Year. Walton Jr. is the first Gatorade Michigan Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Chandler Park Academy.

The 6-foot-1, 190-pound senior point guard averaged 26.2 points, 10.1 assists, 7.7 rebounds and 5.4 steals while shooting 80.7 percent from the free throw line this past season, leading the Eagles (20-4) to the Class B regional semifinals. A First Team All-State selection, Walton scored a season-high 40 points in a win over Rogers High (Toledo, Oh) and scored at least 20 points in all but four games this season.

Walton has maintained a 3.5 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered on behalf of multiple community service initiatives in association with the National Honor Society, in addition to serving as a youth basketball coach.

"Derrick Walton's work ethic and determination is absolutely phenomenal," said Chandler Park athletic director John Jergovich. "He's here every morning at 6 a.m. before school starts taking shots and working on his game. He's a gogetter on and off the court. Once he sets his goals, both athletically and academically, he'll do anything to reach them."

Walton has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Michigan this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Walton Jr. joins recent Gatorade Michigan Boys Basketball Players of the Year Matt Costello (2011-12 & 2010-11, Bay City Western High School), Ray McCallum (2009-10 & 2008-09, Detroit Country Day School), Brad Redford (2007-08, Frankenmuth High School), and Corperryale 'Manny' Harris (2006 – 07, Redford) among the state's list of former award winners.
