MOSS POINT HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSISSIPPI BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The Sun Herald Player of the Year, Booker is also a member of the Clarion-Ledger Dandy Dozen. He is rated the nation's No. 19 recruit in the Class of 2014 by ESPN.

Booker has maintained a 3.81 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a literacy-outreach initiative.

"He has no weakness in his game," said Anthony Combs, head coach at Pascagoula High. "He has tremendous range on his jumper, he can take it strong to the hole and he can finish. A lot of people overlook his passing, but he makes some great passes in the open court and through double teams."

Booker will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
