JUNEAU-DOUGLAS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALASKA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 165-pound senior forward and midfielder has scored 25 goals and passed for 18 assists this season, leading the Crimson Bears to a 14-2-2 record entering this week's regular season game with Thunder Mountain, scheduled for May 16. Lehnhart was a First Team All-State selection in 2012 and earned MVP honors in the 2011 Class 4A state championship game.

Lehnhart has maintained a 3.95 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a homeless shelter, community clean-up initiatives and youth soccer programs.

"Jackson Lehnhart is a complete player," said Dan Rufner, head coach at Service High. "He plays with good pace and he's all over the field. He can score and his defense is great too."

Lehnhart will attend Amherst College this fall, where he will play soccer.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
