LAFAYETTE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE LOUISANA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 14, 2013) — In its 28th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Ethan Judice of Lafayette High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade Louisana Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-9, 176-pound senior midfielder and forward scored 13 goals and passed for 17 assists this past season, leading the Mighty Lions (24-2-2) to the Division I state semifinals. Judice is a two-time First Team All-State selection and was named Division I MVP by the Louisiana High School Soccer Coaches Association.

Judice has maintained a 3.02 GPA in the classroom. A member of his church youth group, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs and community clean-up initiatives.

"Judice is a very talented player," said Michael Ritch, head coach at St. Thomas More High. "He's athletic, plays with great pace and he can create for his teammates."

Judice has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of West Florida this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
