OAK MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALABAMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-3 senior forward scored 47 goals and passed for 35 assists this past season, leading the Eagles (22-4-2) to the Class 6A state championship game. A member of the U.S. Soccer Under-20 Women's National Team, Payne was the 2012 Birmingham News Player of the Year. She concluded her prep soccer career with 141 goals and 92 assists.

Payne has maintained a 3.63 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a teacher in her church's Children's Ministry in addition to donating her time at a homeless shelter and food bank.

"What makes Toni so dangerous is her ability on the ball," said Todd Schaefer, head coach of Hoover High. "It is extremely difficult to take the ball from her. Her foot skills allow her to really hold it. I think she is invaluable when it comes to their success."

Payne has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Duke University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
