OLATHE EAST HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE KANSAS GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 junior midfielder has led the Hawks to a 14-2-1 record and a berth in the Class 6A state quarterfinals against Blue Valley Northwest High, scheduled for May 21. Hanson scored 13 goals and passed for 16 assists through 17 games. She was a 2012 First Team All-Sunflower League selection and a 2012 Second Team All-Region honoree by the Northeast Kansas Soccer Coaches Association.

Hanson has maintained a 3.5 GPA in the classroom. A representative on the Olathe East High student council, she has volunteered locally as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with her church youth group.

"Haley Hanson is a blue collar, great work ethic type of player," said Huw Williams, Hanson's club coach with Sporting Blue Valley. "But she is also much more as she is technical and powerful. She also creates and scores goals and is very versatile."

Hanson has verbally committed to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Nebraska beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
