MANDEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE LOUISIANA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 21, 2013) — In its 28th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Delaney Sheehan of Mandeville High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade Louisiana Girls Soccer Player of the Year. Sheehan is the second Gatorade Louisiana Girls Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Mandeville High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Sheehan as Louisiana's best high school girls soccer player. The 5-foot-4 senior forward scored 56 goals and passed for 31 assists this past season, leading the Lady Skippers (24-5-3) to the Division I state quarterfinals. The state's returning Gatorade Girls Soccer Player of the Year, Sheehan was an All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. She has been a First Team All-State honoree each of the last four seasons and was chosen the Division I Player of the Year by the Louisiana High School Soccer Coaches Association.

Sheehan has maintained a 4.59 GPA in the classroom. A member of her school's Key Club, she has served in student government and has volunteered locally on behalf of Habitat for Humanity.

"Sheehan is very strong technically and tactically," said Al Silvis, head coach at Dominican High. "She was really an impact player for her team."

Sheehan has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Furman University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Sheehan joins Gatorade Louisiana Girls Soccer Players of the Year Katherine Cuntz (2010 - 11, St. Mary's Dominican High School), Emily Cancienne (2009-10, Baton Rouge Magnet), Tricia Johnson (2008-09 St. Scholastica Academy), Kellie Murphy (2007-08, St. Thomas More Catholic), and Hannah Macormic (2006-2007, Mandeville) among the state's list of former award winners.
