MADISON CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSISSIPPI GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-1 senior forward scored 37 goals and passed for 17 assists this past season, leading the Jaguars (18-3-2) to the Class 6A state quarterfinals. A member of the U.S. Soccer Federation U-18 Women's National Team, Crowder is a First Team All-State selection and was named Miss Soccer by the Clarion-Ledger.

Crowder has maintained a 3.70 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the U.S. Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program, the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life, food drives to benefit the needy and a homeless shelter.

"She's extremely quick and her first step is outstanding," said Thomas Bobo, head coach at Clinton High. "She has a great knack for scoring goals. She's always been the one player you have to account for at all times."

Crowder has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Georgia this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
