## WEST ANCHORAGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10 senior right-handed pitcher, shortstop and catcher and infielder posted a 9-5 record along with a 1.61 ERA, 140 strikeouts and a 0.79 WHIP in 87 innings this past season, leading the Eagles (16-8) to the Large School semifinals. The two-time returning Gatorade Alaska Softball Player of the Year, Tufi also batted .842 with 6 home runs, 36 RBI and a 1.474 slugging percentage.

Tufi has maintained a 3.97 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Salvation Army, a food bank and the Nunaka Valley Little League.

"Pauline Tufi is one of my favorite players I have seen in Alaska," said Andy Fowkes, head coach at South Anchorage High. "She is just a great kid who works extremely hard and gets the job done with no showing off."

Tufi has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on an athletic scholarship at Louisiana Tech University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
