DALLAS CENTER-GRIMES HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® IOWA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10 left-handed pitcher and first baseman posted a 31-4 record with a 0.39 ERA, 353 strikeouts and a 0.61 WHIP in 233.1 innings as a sophomore last season, leading the Mustangs (35-6) to the 2012 Class 4A state final. The 2012 Class 4A Pitcher of the Year, Lowary, now a junior, also batted .364 with 4 home runs, 28 RBI and 24 runs scored.

Lowary has maintained a 3.98 GPA in the classroom. An active parishioner in her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Dallas County CROP Hunger Walk and as a youth softball coach.

"Paige Lowary is a talented pitcher and player and I have watched her lead her team to many victories," said Stacy Evans, head coach at Indianola High. "She commands respect when she's in the circle or at the plate."

Lowary has made a verbal commitment to play softball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Missouri beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
