## MILLARD SOUTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEBRASKA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9 junior catcher led the Patriots (29-5) to the Class A state championship this past season. Unzicker hit .536 with 12 home runs, 42 RBI and 50 runs scored. Captain of the Omaha World-Herald All-Nebraska Team, she was also a member of the Lincoln Journal Star Super-State Team. Unzicker matched the Class A record for career home runs with 25.

Unzicker has maintained a 3.92 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of a homeless shelter, the American Red Cross and youth softball programs.

"There are no weaknesses in her swing, and she is a great power hitter," said Mark Watt, head coach at Lincoln Southwest High. "Defensively, she's very, very good, and her arm is strong enough that you just don't want to try to steal against her."

Unzicker will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
