GEORGETOWN VISITATION PREPARATORY SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 sophomore distance runner won the 1600-meter run with a time of 4:56.70 and the 3200-meter run in 10:55.37 this spring, leading the Cubs to the Independent School League championship as a team. The 2012-13 Gatorade District of Columbia Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year, Kaplan set ISL records in both the 1600 and the 3200, and also set a meet record in the 3200 at the Northern Virginia Invitational with a time of 10:42.17.

Kaplan has maintained a 4.30 GPA and is ranked first in her graduating class. She has volunteered locally on behalf of an assisted living facility.

"Emily Kaplan is an extremely hard-working and accomplished high school student-athlete," said Jim Ehrenhaft, head coach at the National Cathedral School. "Her performances this spring were phenomenal."

Kaplan will begin her junior year of high school this fall.
